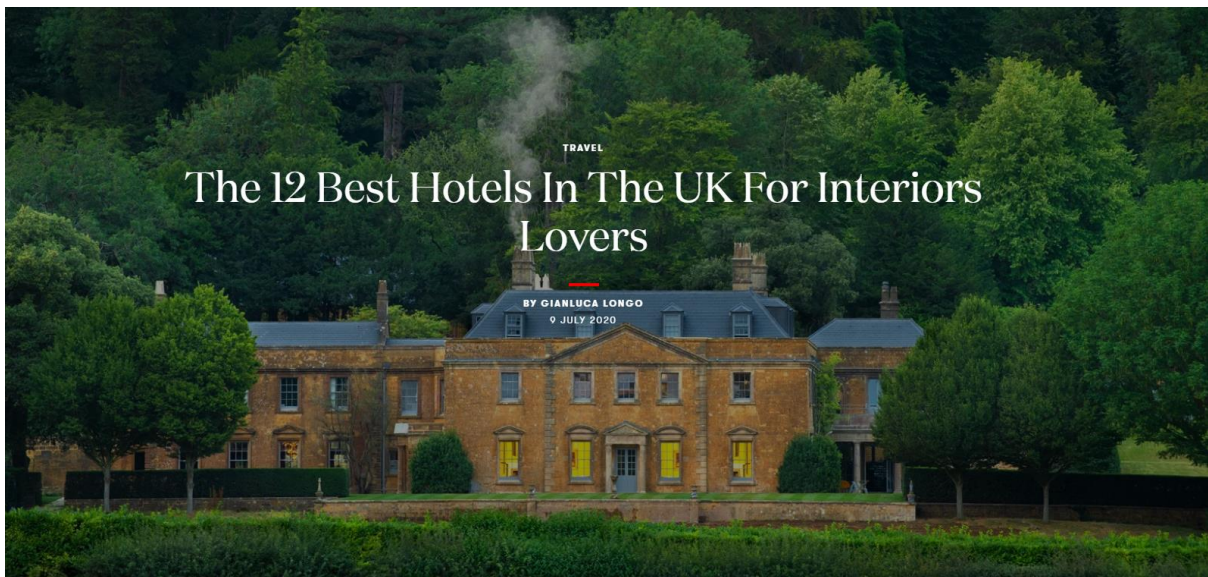

Here, a selection of British *Vogue's* favourite UK-based hotels with interiors to make you swoon.



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Burgh Island Hotel, South Devon

What could be more exciting than being able to walk to a hotel only when the tide is low? Even better, [Burgh Island Hotel](#) in South Devon is a carefully preserved example of original Art Deco architecture. Shaped like a cruise ship, it has occupied this tidal island since 1929, with all the chrome, geometry and varnished wood that characterises the period. Every room is different in style, with wonderfully designed bedheads, furniture and armchairs. Staying really takes you back to the fabulous 1930s – Agatha Christie wrote two of her books here, and Noël Coward was a frequent visitor to the island.
