Explore a storied County Down palace For the first time in its long history, Northern Ireland's newly renovated Hillsborough Castle - the Royal and government residence that has played host to guests including Benjamin Franklin, Margaret Thatcher and Bill Clinton - is opening its doors daily to the public. Roam the beautifully landscaped grounds, before venturing into the Georgian house's opulent state-rooms to admire the silk-lined walls, open fireplaces and cascading chandeliers. YASMIN OMAR

STITCHES **INTIME** Flora Soames' beautifully woven heritage

he interior designer Flora Soames, who divides her time between Dorset and London, has created SOAMES, RIGHT her first range of fabrics and wallpapers, many GARLAND' FABRIC. of which are bursting with blooms.

The designs are reminiscent of antique textiles: a delicate Arts and Crafts cloth was the starting point for 'Chartwell Weave'; a goldthreaded Syrian fabric sparked the idea for 'Oulton Stripe'; and a scrap of early-20th-century linen led to 'Enid's Garland', which is named after Soames' beloved dachshund. The former furniture dealer has the painterly patterns woven in traditional British mills and printed by hand, in bold colourways. Partly inspired by the furnishings her

grandmother loved, the designs are imbued with a deep sense of nostalgia. 'But they are not polite, or precious,' says Soames. 'The collection is a cacophony of colour.' CHARLOTTE BROOK (www.florasoames.com)
